ITD initiated a Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) study in late 2021 to examine ways to improve safety and reduce congestion on the US-20 corridor between Ashton and the SH-87 junction.

Using technical data and input gathered at public meetings in October 2021 and December 2021 the project team developed dozens of alternatives that have been screened based on a range of criteria including safety, capacity, and environmental impacts.
